Many outstanding artists and designers, all of them past pupils of King Edward VI High School for Girls, are currently taking part in an exhibition as

part of the school's 125th anniversary appeal.

KEHS is using the celebrations to raise additional funds for its means-tested bursaries scheme. This scheme aims to enable more young girls, who would not otherwise be able to attend, to benefit from a place at the school.

One of the best-known names exhibiting is Emily Porter-Salmon, who is also donating a portrait commission to the winner of a raffle-style draw. Emily is the youngest member of the RBSA

and her work has appeared in numerous prestigious exhibitions, including the Singer and Friedlander/Sunday Times Watercolour Competition, the Royal Society of Portrait Painters annual exhibition and the BP Portrait

Award at the National Portrait Gallery. Her portraits usually sell for around £2,500.

She is one of nine exhibitors, including Karen Cheung, Sara Hayward, Lesley Cotton and Miriam Elgon.
